Best fish tacos in San Antonio? The SA Express-News thinks so. In February the newspaper published their list of the 10 Best Fish Tacos in San Antonio. #2 on the list was Paladar Fusion Mexico Cuba, located on Ave. B across from the Witte Museum parking garage. Maybe you know the location better as the backside of the former Park Motel, 3615 Broadway. The newspaper reported the owners' affections for Mexican and Cuban foods is successfully expressed and that "Paladar is one of the strongest restaurant openings of the past year." Of the fish tacos it was written, "Great fish tacos fly their own flag here, a trio constructed with true nixtamal tortillas, grilled red snapper with sesame and a dress of pico de gallo, avocado, microgreens and chile seco aioli."

The Half Price Books store at 3207 Broadway will close May 5. This sad news was announced last month. The property was purchased by Glenn Huddleston, who also purchased the adjacent property at 3127 Broadway occupied by Antiquarian Bookstore – which is set to close this spring, too. Huddleston owns multiple properties on Broadway, including the former Intercontinental Motors auto dealership at 3303 Broadway built in 1963 with its "exceptional auto showroom" designed by architects O'Neil Ford and Howard Wong.

MEET MPNA BOARD MEMBER WENDOLLYN MILLER

Wendollyn Miller of Natalen Avenue was elected to the MPNA Board of Directors in November. She has lots of ideas about the neighborhood while still realizing that she needs to know more history to put things in perspective. Wen has lived in Mahncke Park for three years. She grew up in San Antonio, attended Roosevelt High School and Texas A&M/San Antonio, with a year in Belgium as an exchange student. After earning her master's degree in public administration, she now works at Lackland AFB. Wen is interested in getting involved in local community organizations, where she sees real value to everyone involved. Of course, she also needs time to feed her interest in international travel.

Wen identified the following neighborhood concerns: homeless persons that can often be found near the fountain in Mahncke Park, overflow parking from the Botanical Garden, and the future of the Lamar Elementary campus. Following an orientation meeting for new board members, she recognized the value of continuity from last year's board to this year's board - a major concern of hers. NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORY, PART 2,103,813,093

Early area history includes arrival by a Spanish patrol on June 13, 1691. Drawn to the river and its springs surrounded by great trees and abundant wildlife, a priest accompanying the soldiers said Mass on the riverbank and the commanding officer wrote in his diary, "We traveled over a broad plain (the most beautiful in all of New Spain) and we called this place San Antonio because we arrived here on his day." The feast day of Saint Anthony ("San Antonio") is June 13 and due to the Spanish general naming this location for the significance of the date they arrived, over 300 years later we continue to call this place San Antonio.

The Spanish returned to establish a permanent settlement in 1718. Mission San Antonio de Valero was initially located west of the SA River, closer to San Pedro Creek. Later, the mission relocated to a site east of the SA River and is better known today as the Alamo. The mission required water for domestic and agricultural uses; therefore, the technology of moving water was introduced by the Spanish via a series of hand-dug ditches ("acequias") which operated strictly by means of gravity. The first acequia in SA was fed from a bend in the river (located today behind the Witte Museum) and curved through our present day Mahncke Park Neighborhood on its way toward the mission. In 2001, medallions were installed in sidewalks from Pershing Ave. to Mulberry Ave. marking the route of the Acequia Madre, San Antonio's first Spanish acequia.
