S.A. BOTANICAL GARDEN NEWS

Katherine Trumble is the new President & Chief Executive Officer of the San Antonio Botanical Garden (aka "The Garden").

Reed Hilderbrand, a landscape architecture practice based in Cambridge, MA and New Haven, CT, has been engaged to create a new master plan for The Garden. CITY TO RE-INSTALL BIKE LANES

Public Works Dept. has committed to re-install bike lanes on N. New Braunfels Avenue between Eleanor Avenue and Burr Road no later than July 30, 2024. The bike lane striping was removed in April 2023 when the street was resurfaced.

MAHNCKE PARK COMMUNITY GARDEN

Total rainfall for May was only 1.54" so the community garden will soon begin to change from "spring lush" to "summer sparse." Dedicated gardeners will be working hard to produce tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and okra as the temperature rises. Some gardeners will take a break until late summer when they begin planting their fall gardens.

NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORY: LUDWIG MAHNCKE

Ludwig Mahncke was born April 20, 1846 in Mecklenburg, Germany. His early career was in the liquor business; however, failing fortune convinced him to emigrate to America. Finding few opportunities, Mahncke took work as a cook for a party of road builders in Mexico. Accounts differ but an altercation occurred and Mahncke "picked up a bone from the leg of a beef that had just been slaughtered" and struck a man over the head with it. Thinking he had killed the man and uncertain of his opportunity for justice, Mahncke fled to Texas. After arriving in San Antonio in 1882, his wife and two daughters joined him. (SA Express, 3/27/1906)

Ludwig Mahncke prospered in San Antonio. He was a member of Hermann Sons Lodge, Odd Fellows, Woodmen of the World, and the Order of Elks. He first managed the Mission Garden on South Alamo, then the restaurant in Scholz's Saloon on Alamo Plaza, finally opening the Mahncke Hotel in 1886. Located at the NE corner of Houston Street and St. Mary's Street (present day site of the Gunter Hotel), the Mahncke Hotel was a successful enterprise and its saloon was a popular gathering place.

Mahncke served as alderman (city councilman) and later became San Antonio's first Parks Commissioner in 1896, serving until shortly before his death from pneumonia on March 27, 1906. Sculptor Pompeo Coppini was commissioned to create the bronze bust of Mahncke that stands in the park named in his honor. In 1964, his daughter Anna Marie Mahncke Deutz donated the fountain in Mahncke Park, and a Texas Historical Commission marker commemorating Ludwig Mahncke was installed nearby in 2011.

MEET MPNA BOARD MEMBER C.J. VAN GREEN

C.J. Van Green may be new to the MPNA Board this year, but in a sense she has been here a long time. Eleven years ago, she moved into the house on Lucas Street where her grandmother lived much of her life. C.J. came to San Antonio to be with her mother, and through her extended family has connections with four generations of Mahncke Park residents.

This energetic woman has ideas for Mahncke Park that include the newsletter, new residents, and fundraising. C.J. has experience with non-profit entities, and she recently saved money for the MPNA by establishing a free checking account at Broadway Bank. A self-confessed foodie, C.J. is another neighbor appreciative of interesting restaurants on Broadway, rather than more fast food franchises.

In addition to food, C.J. loves all fur babies and has indoor cats. She also likes art and music. In the course of our interview, C.J. mentioned her grandmother told her the area of our neighborhood east of North New Braunfels was once known as "frog town" and the area west of the street was known as "toad town."
